Note: the prices displayed are indicative and reflect current projections; they may be subject to minor variations. If this is the case, you will be informed in a timely manner.

### Note a (Registration Fees):

The amount is non-refundable even if the student does not come or leaves over the course of the year. It includes the Quebec Acceptance Certificate application process. If the Quebec Acceptance Certificate or the study permit request is denied, a refund of \$1,000 will be granted upon presentation of the refusal letter from the provincial or federal Immigration Ministry.

### Note b (Tuition Fees):

This amount includes the Parents Association membership, the Students Fund (for on-campus school activities) and educational material.

### Note c (7-day boarding):

Based on a single room. Meals, extracurricular activities within the boarding school, and laundry services are included in the accommodation fees. Accommodation is provided for the whole school year except for the two-week break over the December Holidays.

## Note d (Activities):

This amount covers various on-campus activities (i.e. fitness training, Halloween, workshops, cooking, events and shows, etc.) as well as excursions such as ski day, waterpark, zipline, camping, movies, amusement park, apple picking, sugar shack, Montreal tours, etc.

#### Note e (French Immersion Class):

French immersion classes are mandatory for beginner level students. These courses are given 3 to 4 times a week (\$3,780).

#### Note f (Deposit):

The deposit is used to cover some of the following expenses: school uniform, laptop, insurance coverage, medical care, medication, refresher courses, legalization of report card (\$200), additional transportation as well as other expenses that may arise over the course of the school year. See page 3 for more information. What is not spent on the deposit will be returned or will be kept in your account if the student is readmitted.

# CAD \$2,500 deposit for international students

It can be used to cover some of the following charges:

#### Uniform

Expect to spend approx. \$500 through our supplier and/or approx. \$200 at our second-hand store.

#### International insurance

Approximately \$750. Foreign students must have Quebec health insurance coverage. It must be purchased via the College via the company StudyInsured, broker.

#### Other

School supplies, textbooks, medical care, medication, special activities, additional transportation, etc.

#### **Optional fees**

**Passion Pathway programs** offer the opportunity to explore various options and discover new interests in the fields of sports, the arts, languages, and robotics.

#### \*Laptop

All new Grade 9 students are expected to order the College laptop. The 23-24 model in use is an 11-inch convertible (laptop and tablet) computer with a smart pen and a 3-year warranty. It is equiped with Windows Education, the Office series, the Google Education suite, and other pedagogical tools.

#### **iPad**

Grade 10 and 11 students must bring their own iPad. It must be at least a 9th generation iPad. A fee of approx. \$60 will be charged to reset and configure your device for the school with all the proper applications.
